

Doane University Peer List

The Doane University Peer List should be used as the starting point of comparisons for institutions. Doane University serves an intricate mix of undergraduate, graduate, and non-degree-seeking students in residential, commuter, and online environments.

These institutions should serve as the starting point for comparing characteristics at institutions. It is also recommended to often use ratios (faculty to student) rather than absolute numbers in comparisons.

How was the list created?

Institutions were selected using IPEDS (Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System), a system of interrelated surveys conducted annually by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCEI) and graduate students located in the Plains or Midwest

region. This initial list of 32 institutions was then refined to include those focusing on the liberal arts, resulting in the 16 institutions listed below.

Why is (blank institution) missing from the list? They are just like us—they are our competitors!

Many of our competitors for students have different operational diversity at the regional level. For example, many students who apply for admission to the Crete campus attend the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. While this is valuable to know for enrollment purposes, using UNL in a peer list to generate comparisons of faculty-student ratios, resource allocation, tuition pricing, or the number of students per faculty member is not recommended.
